"What's within you is stronger than what's in your way," adventurer, author, speaker, and philanthropist Erik Weihenmayer told a packed house at Secrest Auditorium on Thursday, December 14. High school sophomores, freshmen, faculty and staff, and community members heard Weihenmayer during the third Mary Helen Straker Award in Writing. The J.W. & M.H. Straker Charitable Foundation sponsored the event; its President and Executive Director Susan Straker Holdren and Weihenmayer presented 21 students from throughout Muskingum County with awards recognizing the excellence of their essays.

Sophomores in participating county high schools read the young adult version of Weihenmayer's book, *No Barriers*, in response to a prompt asking them to write about a challenge described in the book. Then the students considered their own challenges and responses.

"A lot of planning, resources, and creativity go into making this event a reality," said Mrs. Holdren. "Mary Helen Straker, my mother, was a writer, and this event's goal is to awaken students to the joys and rewards of good writing. While we wish every school system in the county had participated, we are excited at the quality of the essays received and the courage and transparency with which students addressed the prompt."
